Destination Value Total Return Fund is a **multi-strategy global portfolio**. The portfolio has a benchmark-free¹, **high conviction** approach to stock selection anchored in fundamental valuations. By allocating to **proprietary strategies** rather than asset classes, the portfolio focuses on identifying **idiosyncratic opportunities** in a global set of traditional and alternative asset classes. An important goal of the portfolio is to achieve true **diversification**, recognizing time and correlation as key diversifiers. The objective of this Fund is to achieve a superior risk adjusted total return over the market cycle. Realising long-term capital appreciation and underlying income through a long term focus on valuation and the market cycles is paramount to achieving the Fund’s objectives.

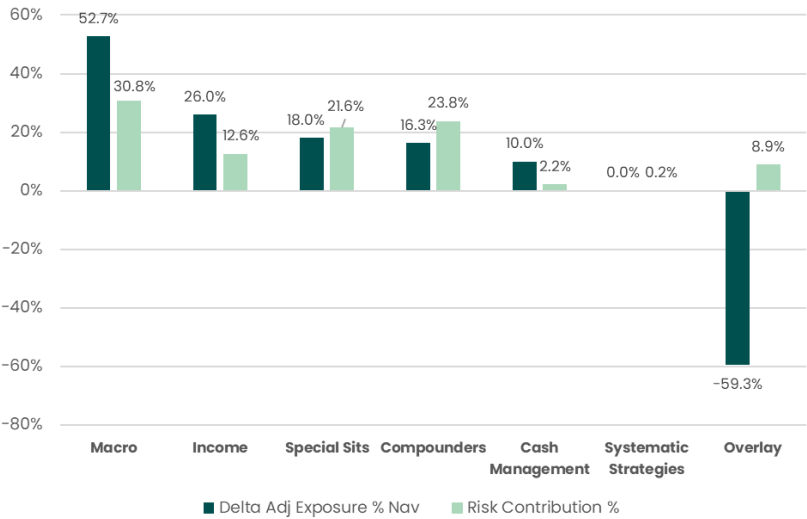

Allocations by strategy



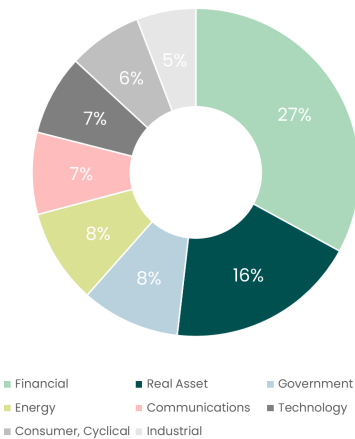

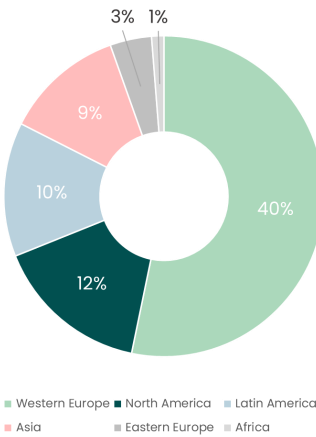

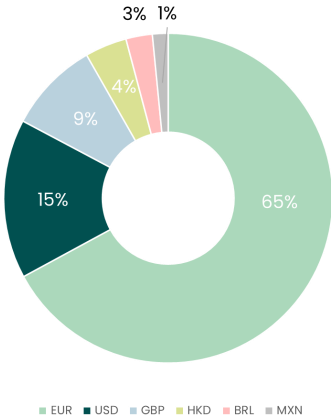

Portfolio Management Commentary – August 2025

<p>COMPOUNDERS</p> <p>+0.20%</p>	<p>The Compounders strategy ended the month with a positive result (+0.20%), mainly supported by Tencent Holdings Ltd (+0.20%) and Tencent Music Entertainment Group (+0.18%), which benefited from the rebound in China and from the release of a new AI search functionality within its ecosystem. Another positive holding was Prysmian SpA (+0.11%), which continued its upward trend supported by the tariffs introduced by the Trump administration on copper, which benefit companies with facilities located in the U.S. CTS Eventim (-0.20%), Meta Platforms Inc (-0.11%), and Interactive Brokers Group Inc (-0.10%) performed negatively. These were driven by slight weakness in the tech sector in the latter half of the month. We selectively trimmed these positions, while keeping the strategy and portfolio's core identity intact.</p>
<p>INCOME</p> <p>+0.57%</p>	<p>The Income strategy contributed positively (+0.57%). The Financials segment (+0.38%) was the largest contributor, led by Intesa Sanpaolo SpA (+0.04%) and AXA SA (+0.03%). There were no significant detractors. The Energy segment (+0.07%) also supported, with Repsol Europe Finance Sart (+0.02%) and Var Energi ASA (+0.02%). Auto Income added modestly (+0.04%) from Volkswagen International Finance NV.</p>
<p>MACRO GOLD</p> <p>+0.39%</p>	<p>The Macro Strategy – Gold delivered a solid gain (+0.39%). Gold remains one of our best convictions, we currently have a position of almost 10% in it. YTD it has been one of the best asset classes in terms of performance.</p>
<p>MACRO FI</p> <p>+0.16%</p>	<p>The Macro Strategy – Fixed Income strategy posted a gain (+0.16%). Rates Global contributed (+0.09%), supported by Mexico Bonos 8.50% 2030 (+0.03%) and Brazil Notas do Tesouro Nacional Serie B 6.00% 2030 (+0.03%). Both these positions were increased, with the former continuing to offer appealing nominal yields and the latter offering high real yields and price in a conservative easing cycle. Overall, with spreads at or below historical tightness in both developed and liquid EM markets, and with global yields repricing, EM local markets now appear relatively more attractive. We maintain a cautious stance. Our curve steepening trade (long US 10YR note, short US 2YR note) added +0.06%. During the month, the 2y-10y steepener position was left unchanged, in line with our medium-term structural view. We expect to continue seeing attractive asymmetry in the 2-5y segment of the U.S. curve, which may offer protection in case of economic slowdown. The steepener remains one of our high-conviction medium-term trades.</p>
<p>MACRO EQUITY</p> <p>+0.76%</p>	<p>The Macro Strategy – Equity ended higher (+0.76%). The Energy segment was the main contributor (+0.53%), which is comprised of positions in Uranium ETCs. Exposure to the uranium sector increased slightly to 6.5%, in line with strong sector performance. Banks also added (+0.12%) from UniCredit SpA (+0.06%) and HSBC Holdings PLC (+0.05%). In line with the reduction of equity exposure, total exposure to European banks (excl. Greece) was reduced to 1.5% of the portfolio. The Greece segment contributed positively (+0.11%), led by Piraeus Financial Holdings SA (+0.06%). In this segment, we took profit on strong performance as well as valuation normalisation. This segment was reduced to 5% of the portfolio. Overall, the month was marked by a significant de-risking of equity exposure. In our view, the gradual weakening of technical tailwinds, macro slowdown risks, uncertainty over new tariffs, and growing concerns about the true economic sustainability of AI-related investment, specifically in terms of tangible earnings impact for adopters, reinforce our prudence. In this context, we plan to maintain a defensive positioning until more attractive opportunities emerge from a risk/reward perspective.</p>
<p>SPECIAL SITUATIONS</p> <p>+0.62%</p>	<p>The Special Situations strategy contributed positively (+0.62%). Special Sits Equity contributed (+0.41%), with Nebius Group NV (+0.21%), Vodafone Group PLC (+0.20%), and Avio SpA (+0.15), and detracted by Ivanhoe Electric Inc (-0.16%). In line with the de-risking of equity exposure, this sub-strategy saw positions more substantially reduced. Specifically, the position in Webuild SpA was trimmed to below 2%. Special Sits Fixed Income added (+0.21%), supported by GOL Finance Inc 14.375% 2030 (+0.03%) and MC Brazil Downstream Trading SARL 7.250% 2031 (+0.03%).</p>
<p>SYSTEMATIC STRATEGIES –</p> <p>0.04%</p>	<p>The Systematic Strategies closed slightly negative (-0.04%). FX Carry added marginally (+0.05%), but Pair Trading (-0.02%), Trend Following (-0.03%), and Vola Term Strategy (-0.05%) detracted.</p>
<p>OVERLAY</p> <p>+0.14%</p>	<p>The Overlay strategy finished positive (+0.14%). Overlay FX provided strong support (+0.42%), led by USD/EUR 10/16/25 (+0.36%). During the month, net dollar exposure in the portfolio increased to 19%. While our structural view remains constructive for medium-term USD weakness, following strong performance year-to-date, we opted to reduce the long EUR/USD position, thus returning to a more neutral USD exposure. Overlay Rates added (+0.06%), while Overlay Hedge weighed (-0.30%), driven by EURO STOXX 50 Price EUR put option, expiring 19/10/25 (-0.14%) and S&P 500 INDEX put options expiring 29/08/25 (-0.09%) and 19/09/25 (-0.09%). These positions follow the reduction in equity exposure by lowering implied equity risk. This brought net equity exposure down to 20.5% at the end of August, including -11.5% delta from the options. We plan on maintaining a defensive positioning until more attractive opportunities emerge from a risk/reward perspective.</p>
